

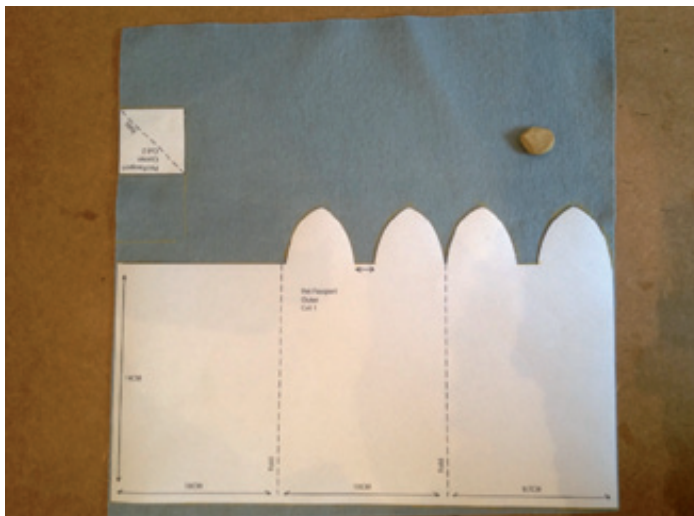
# PET PASSPORT

If you're taking your pet on hols you'll need to check whether they need a passport.  
Get your pet ready to travel in style with our personalised passport holder.



## Tools Needed

- 30 x 30 CM felt in chosen colours. For this sample we used black, red and grey.
- Hand sewing needle
- Thread
- Tailors chalk or fabric pen
- 2 Buttons for eyes
- Velcro or similar product
- Glue stick or non-toxic craft glue
- Pet Passport Patterns 1 & 2 (download and print)
- Ferret, dog or cat design (download and print)



1) Print out pattern (when printing do not scale to fit), cut out around black lines and punch holes through circles. Trace around the pattern using tailors chalk or fabric pen, mark circles with a dot (these are to show where to place your appliqué features), cut out felt.

1a) Choose either dog, cat or ferret design, print and transfer features onto front of felt using fabric pen.



2) Using a small back stitch fix Velcro or similar product to paw and right side of centre panel matching corners of Velcro or similar product with dots. Back stitch around all 4 sides to hold in place.

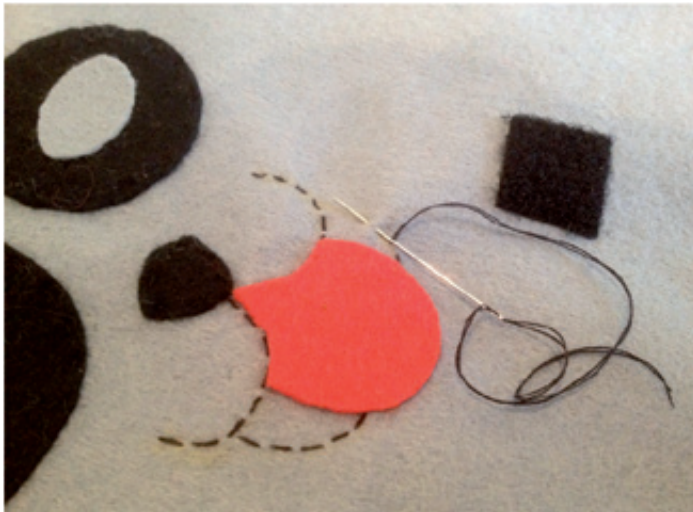
3) Match felt features with dots on centre panel and fix with a little glue stick or non-toxic craft glue to hold in place whilst sewing.



4) Sew felt features to centre panel using a 5MM running stitch. Finish with a back stitch or knot to secure stitching.

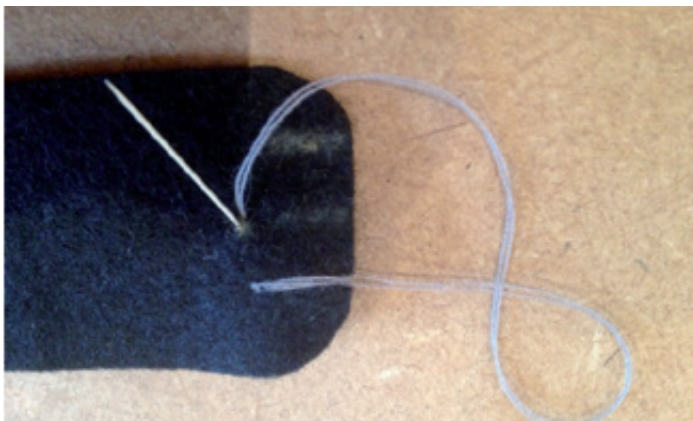


5) Join dots to create stitch lines for nose and mouth using a fabric pen or tailors chalk.



6) Stitch around features using a double thread running stitch.

NOTE: For cat and ferret whiskers and eyebrows secure a double thread to the felt using a small back stitch and leave the thread end loose. Trim to your preferred length.



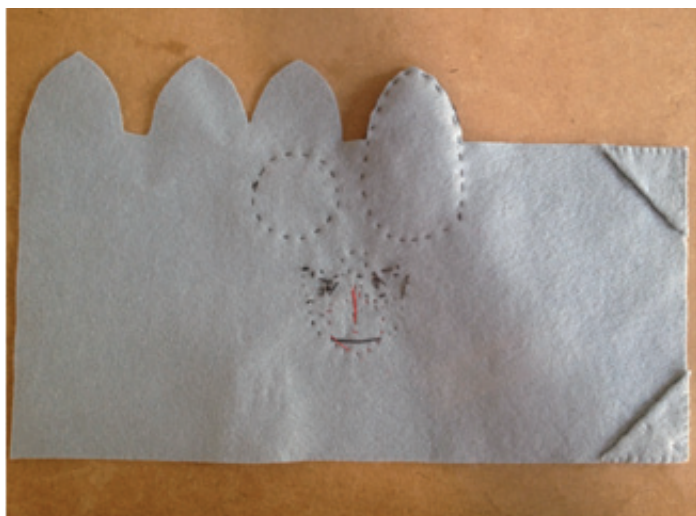
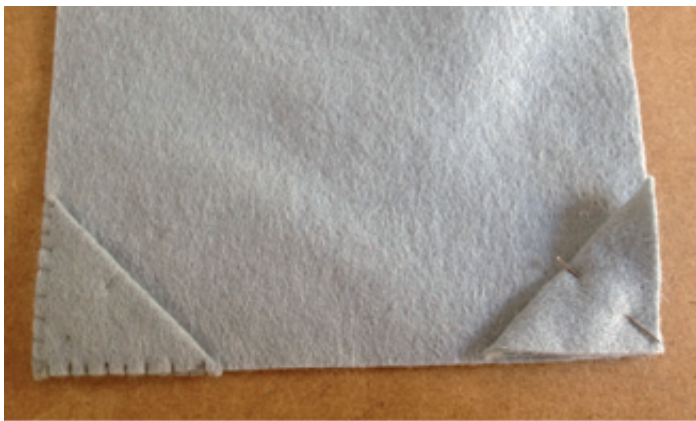
7) Stitch 3 paw lines on top paw piece (the one without the Velcro or similar product on). Using a double thread make a long stitch starting 1CM in from the felt edge, take the thread over the edge of the paw and bring the needle back up through where you started to create a loop. Do this twice to create a line 4 threads thick then repeat for the other two lines.



8) Fix paw front and back together using a little glue. Stitch around edges using a small blanket stitch in the same colour as your felt.

NOTE: For cat and ferret make paw lines slightly closer together.





9. Fold corner squares in half diagonally and fix with a little glue to create a triangle. Match up the raw edges of the triangle with the inside edge on panel 3 of your passport cover, pin in place. Blanket stitch all 3 layers together.



10. Pin paw strip in place along centre back panel. Make sure that your Velcro or similar product tabs match up. Using a small running stitch join panel to your passport cover.



11. Using chalk trace out your pets name along the centre of the paw panel. Stitch along lines with a long running stitch using a double thread.



12. Position buttons for eyes and sew on using a double thread.
